Astrid Schomaker is **Director for Green Diplomacy and Multilateralism** at the European Commission's Directorate General for the Environment. As such, she is in charge of international relations, economic analysis, international resource efficiency, better regulation and environment policy strategy, including the alignment of environment policy with the 2030 Agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals.

She studied English, history and law in Hamburg and Norwich and has an LLM in international legal cooperation from Brussels' Free University. After a brief stint in academia in Germany and the US, she joined the European Commission in 1992. She held various posts in the external affairs department, dealing with EU - US relations first at headquarters and then in the Commission's Washington Delegation, before returning to Brussels to work on relations with Japan and then the Andean Community. Ms Schomaker moved to the Environment Department in 2004 and has lead work on a variety of issues ranging from bilateral and multilateral relations to chemicals, oceans and water industry as well as, more recently, strategy, overall coordination and communication. She took up her present position in July 2016.
