

Leonard Mizzi

Dr Leonard Mizzi is Head of Unit at the European Commission, Director-General (DG) for International Cooperation and Development - Rural development, food security and nutrition, since 1st of January 2017. Formerly, he has been Head of Unit for 10 years at DG Agriculture and Rural Development, firstly in charge of agri-trade and development issues (2007-2014) and from 2015-2016 in charge of the inter-institutional unit hence leading the relations with the European Parliament, Council and consultative bodies and well as steering the Civil Dialogue Groups.

He is a graduate in Public Administration from the University of Malta (BA Hons First Class), and is a graduate from CIHEAM-Montpellier (MSc) and a PhD in Agricultural Economics from the University of Reading (UK).

He is the author of several articles and publications on agri-food issues and nutrition in the Mediterranean region. Dr Leonard Mizzi has a broad working experience in the Maltese public administration and the Maltese private sector. He first worked in the Economic Planning Division of the Office of the Prime Minister (Malta) and, from 1996-2006, he was the first Director of the Malta Business Bureau in Brussels, the office of the Malta Chamber of Commerce and Enterprise and the Malta Hotels and Restaurants Association. He has also been a visiting lecturer at the Boston University (Brussels campus) and the Open University and Malta University. Dr Leonard Mizzi often lectures at the College of Europe in Bruges. His areas of specialisation are Global Food Security Governance, Agriculture and Food and Nutrition Security, the Mediterranean, and Sub Saharan Africa.
